- Ensuring a safe training environment for all athletes while delivering the content in a fun and creative way
- Taking ownership of the athletes' development.
- Keeping up to date training journals and completing report cards for all athletes.
- Assisting in course setting as needed.
- Drive team van daily to training venue and competition venues as needed
- Deliver dryland training program as outlined by Head Coach and S&C coach.
- Ensuring all athletes are abiding by the NASA Code of Conduct.
- Ensuring all KAST issued equipment is maintained and operational throughout the season; and
- Understand the full NASA program and its structure; actively promote the Club to internal and external parties.
