



Alpine Canada Top 10 Coach Program

Introduction and Aim

1. ACA recognizes that one of the key ingredients to achieving sustainable international success at the highest level, is an expert National Team coaching staff consisting of Canadians in most leadership positions.
2. The ACA HP Coach Mentorship program is a high performance coach succession planning initiative that aims to invest in targeted Canadian coaches who demonstrate interest and desire to progress to high performance coaching careers.
3. In collaboration with similar PTSO Coach Mentorship programs operating at a provincial level, this initiative aims to build and track a pool of Canadian high performance coaching talent that can effectively serve provincial and national team coaching needs into the future.

The Program

4. ACA will identify suitable projects annually that will serve as professional development leadership, mentorship and/or interface opportunities for targeted coaches. Projects may include (but not limited to):
 - a. National Team dryland training/fitness testing events
 - b. National Team on snow training camps
 - c. athlete talent ID camps
 - d. coach development camps
 - e. selected competitions (World Cup/World Junior Champs/NorAm/Whistler Cup)
5. Selected coaches will be invited to attend events that match with their personal development needs and career path. Depending on the event attended, benefits include exposure to:
 - a. expert National Team coaches – terminology, philosophy, approach
 - b. IST support team's expertise and philosophy
 - c. high level "at a race" coaching
 - d. setting training and competition environments for athlete success
 - e. course setting
 - f. athlete professionalism
6. An ACA master coach or staff will actively manage the interface between selected coaches and the project environment in which they are placed to ensure an effective result.



7. Coaches will return to their existing employment following participation in the program.
8. ACA and PSOs will track targeted coaches as they progress in the program and in their careers.

Eligibility

9. To be eligible for application to the program, at minimum, coaches must be:
 - a. an ACA-CSCF accredited coach in good standing
 - b. coaching currently in an ACA sanctioned program
 - c. working with FIS level athletes or higher

Selection Criteria

10. Eligible candidates will be selected based on a matrix of related criteria that demonstrate knowledge, skills and attitudes, including but not limited to (in no particular order):
 - coaching experience and successes
 - leadership roles
 - athletic experience
 - alpine coach certification and other sport or related certifications
 - formal education
 - languages
 - coach developer accreditation (course facilitator - evaluator)
 - international exposure and other related criteria

Application Procedure

11. Applications must include:
 - a. covering letter **outlining a commitment to a career in alpine ski coaching and particular interest in high performance coaching.**
 - b. proof of eligibility as per “Eligibility” section above.
 - c. detailed curriculum vitae **providing relevant evidence of knowledge, skills and competencies.**
 - d. reference contacts from at least two (2) recent employers.
 - e. police record check.
